

Dear fortified heritage managers!


This survey is the first step towards a future quantitative study on the importance and the socio-economic value of each of the European countries' fortification heritage sector. Based on the respective EFFORTS Venice Declaration (2018) and Statement in Antwerp (2019), the results of this study will be presented at the livestreamed 2020 ANNUAL EFFORTS CONGRESS. The results will then serve as the basis for the above-mentioned future European study, to be commandeered after 2020.

EFFORTS is a European network organisation established in 2017 to share knowledge and practical expertise on military heritage, such as walled towns, forts and defence lines. Today EFFORTS unites more than 50 European fortified sites and networks and is growing. Since 2018 EFFORTS has been a European professional representation of fortified sites. It is member of the Europa Nostra managed European Heritage Alliance 3.3. Our main mission is the structuring of European cooperation and keeping military fortified heritage on the European policy agenda. EFFORTS believes that European cooperation is the key to





DISCOVERY OF THE SAINT LAWRENCE LUNETTE in ANTWERP : A WELLINGTON PERIOD DUTCH REDOUBT (1818)



End of September, archeologists of EFFORTS Member Antwerp and the Flemish Agency for Immovable Heritage discovered the left flank of the 1818 Wellington Barrier era Sint Laureis / Saint Lawrence lunette, south of the former Antwerp Citadel (see map). The Wellington Barrier is a post-1815 Waterloo large defence line in and around Belgium that served to protect the Netherlands from France. Visible were brick coverd earth walls with pine foundations.

The Saint Lawrence lunette was considered an integral part of the citadel. During the post-Belgian independence war actions of 1832 it was bombarded and captured by Belgium-allied French forces until the citadel, still occupied by the Dutch surrendered on the 23th of December. The Musée des Plans-Reliefs in Paris keeps a model of the attack. The Belgian Army occupied the site after it fell, but the citadel was ordered to be abandoned from 1870 onward. Most of the structures were presumed to be destroyed when the city of Antwerp expanded (milant.be).

What is now discovered cannot be preserved. It will be studied and replaced by the parking garage for the new building on this site. Trough drone and 3D-photography, this unique fortification is being preserved so as to be able to help future fortified sites' research in Europe.

Challenge

St. Michael's fortress is the oldest of four fortresses in Sibenik, dating back to the early medieval period, while Barone Fortress was built in mid-17th century outside the city's historical centre. Both fortresses were left for centuries to decay and had no public utility, or economic or social function anymore. The question was how to give a second life to this heritage while enhancing its cultural value and giving it a new social utility which is economically sustainable?



Solution

The objective of the project was primarily twofold: revitalisation and valorisation of the heritage sites along with the development of cultural contents on

The fortresses were restored to become one of the most visited historical monuments in Croatia, but also transformed into modern cultural and entertainment venues, hosting numerous performances and events.

As a result, these remarkable sites have been preserved and Sibenik has positioned itself as a major cultural hot spot, where tradition and modern technology are successfully blended.



How?

- The St. Michael's and Barone Fortresses were revitalised in 2014 and 2016, respectively.
- The public cultural institution 'Fortress of Culture Šibenik' was founded in 2016 manage and promote Šibenik's fortification system's sustainable use.
- All year the site hosts cultural, educational and entertainment events (dance performances, concerts, movie nights, workshops, conferences, etc.)
- A 'Šibenik Fortresses Friends Club' was created to reconnect local community with its newly revitalised cultural heritage. The club promotes the fortresses' events, raises awareness and creates a sense of ownership among locals.
- Members of the Friends Club are invited to say which sites they would like to see restored in and around Šibenik. Part of the membership fee is invested in cultural programmes, while another part is invested in preservation, research and conservation.
- Products of over 60 local SMEs are presented and sold at the sites. The institution also works with cultural NGOs, local media and educational institutions.
