Gorana BARISIC-BASELIC Gorana Barišić Bačelić is an expert in the management and interpretation of cultural heritage. She graduated art history from the Faculty of Philosophy in Zadar and specialised cultural management at the De Vos Institute of the University of Maryland National Intensive Arts Management - an education programme organized by the Republic of Croatia Ministry of Culture. Her areas of interest focus on sustainable management in culture, interpretation of cultural heritage and audience development. She participated in the preparation, implementation and post-project management of several EU funded projects in culture and heritage. Today, she is the director of Fortress of Culture Šibenik, co-host of the 2020 EFFORTS Congress, and a young public institution that manages revitalized St. Michael's Fortresses and Barone Fortress. Under her leadership, activities and programmes of Šibenik's fortresses are acknowledged in the national as well as European context, which is confirmed by 12 awards from the field of culture, tourism and communication. Tom BERENDSEN has been a Dutch Member of the European Parliament since 2029. In Parliament, he has since been serving on the Committee on Industry, Research and Energy and the Committee on Regional Development. In addition to his committee assignments, he is substitute member of the Committee on Transport and Tourism. He is also a member of the URBAN Intergroup.	
Huibert CRIJNS is programme manager for restoration and development projects and an expert on European funding. Huibert is one of the founders of the European Federation of Fortified Sites, EFFORTS. He studied Architecture (BSc), Construction Management (MSc) and Law. Since 2001 Huibert has managed several restoration and re-development projects on the fortress of 's-Hertogenbosch in the Netherlands, e.g. the improvement of the public space along the town walls. The restoration and development projects in 's-Hertogenbosch received grants from 17 different EU funding programmes and were awarded with the prestigious European Regional Champions Award and the Europa Nostra Award (2010).	
Marnic DE MEULEMEESTER Is Mayor of the Belgian city of Oudenaarde. Active in municipal politics in Oudenaarde for decades. He became a municipal councillor in 1994 and was also a legislator alderman from 1995 to 2000. Since 2001 he has been mayor of the town. In June 2004 he was elected as a Flemish member of Parliament for the electoral district of East Flanders. After the next Flemish elections of June 2009 and May 2014, he remained a member of the Flemish Parliament. At the 2019 elections he was no longer a candidate member of Parliament. Since 15 July 2019 he may call himself an honorary Flemish member of Parliament.

At Marco Polo System geie in Venice (2002 to 2015), he developed +30 EU and Veneto Region funds projects on fortified heritage, cultural heritage and sustainable cultural tourism, collaborating with UNESCO, UNWTO and the Council of Europe. For Veneto Region he was from 2011 to 2014 the project international coordinator of the SEE Cultural Values for Sustainable Territorial Governance and Marketing project. Since 2015 he is project manager/developer at the Department of Economics, Ca' Foscari U. of Venice.
