A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT



As my first foreword as President of EFFORTS, please let me introduce myself. As mayor of the Flemish-Belgian city of Oudenaarde and active in city and national politics for 30 years, it is an honour for me to preside over the European Federation of Fortified Cities. On 10 November it was even a news item in Flanders.

I am equally happy to be able to lead EFFORTS to a new phase of its existence. After a start-up period of 6 years, we must now look towards the future. EFFORTS will focus more on its core business, being a network of innovative cities and sites that, with its knowledge and private partners, puts city renewal at the forefront of their re-use of fortified heritage.

It is for this that I have, with you, supported the drafting of the EFFORTS 2023 Maastricht Manifesto, calling for the optimal use of fortified heritage and the best use of our resources on a European scale. You can read about the Manifesto further down in the Newsletter. We are proud to be presenting the Manifesto to the three EU institutions between December 2023 and March 2024.

We also welcome the Flemish Platform of Fortified Cities (OPVV), set up last May after a year of preparation as a part of EFFORTS and organising in 2024 in Oudenaarde its second conference in the Belgian EU presidency. The OPVV is hopeful to count 10 cities, all via EFFORTS membership, by the end of 2024. Together with EFFORTS actions in Belgium around the Wellington Barrier, France, Italy/Croatia, Netherlands, Finland, Romania and in the Czech Republic, we prove that when we federate our member cities on the level of their national, cross-border regional or European funding in inclusivity, sustainability and innovation, it works for all. This is where we will focus on in the next years.

I am happy also that the Board has been invited by our member in Helsinki for its April meeting and that we will be able to have our experts participate in a dedicated workshop on this UNESCO-guilded

site. This will lead in September 2024 towards the first EFFORTS professional training 'Summer Academy', also in Suomenlinna. After this we will end the year in Cluj-Napoca in Romania, where we will sign the Transsylvanian cities grouped membership at the 2024 EFFORTS congress.

Based on preliminary work with the Zuiderwaterlinie cities, the EFFORTS Maastricht Manifesto was adopted at the EFFORTS 2023 Congress and is being presented to the three EU institutions, Parliament (6 December 2023, to **Tom Berendsen**, **MEP**, **with Noord-Brabant Province deputy Jos** van der Horst, Zuiderwaterlinie cities 's-Hertogenbosch, Heusden, Geertruidenberg and Moerdijk, Europa Nostra (Jimmy Jamar), European Landowners Organisation and the EU Education and Cultural Executive Agency and 3 EFFORTS Board members – vice presidents Anne-Wil Maris and Daniele Sferra, and Eva Roels and Luc Olyslager), European Commission (January 2024, tot the Climate Action Commissioner in Brussels) and the EU Council of Ministers (5 March 2024, at the conference of Flemish Fortified Cities).

the 200 EFFORTS network fortified cities and sites in 21 European countries call for the following actions:

- Start from the needs of the cities, sites and the communities. Build up relations with all the stakeholders. Keys are change analysis, resilience of communities and multi-disciplinary thinking.
- Work towards a long-term vision and towards innovative funding (on all levels, also private). Set up a strategic master plan. Come up with a business case, a SWOT analysis. Start from the local, regional and national level, coming to meeting EU policy needs. Calculate the break-even costs. Make a choice in needs and resources.
- **Combine heritage with multi-sectoral policy**: education, knowledge, memory, development on an integrated level: i.e. spatial policy solutions, green cities, local agriculture and circular economy, mobility, sustainable energy, logistics, culture, creativity, arts and heritage, tourism economy, slow economy and social needs, safe places for refugees.
- Link **shared heritage** with **regional development** possibilities: use the smart specialization capacities of green and built spaces of fortress lines, fortress belts, walled cities. Put together shared heritage in the same region to form the basis of a regional development plan.
- Resolve for the heritage sites **shared heritage governance issues.** Come to the joint management of shared national and European heritage, e.g. regional fortress regions for green, economic, energy or social development
- EU subsidy is not the goal, it needs to be part of the **overall multi-level vision and policy structure** of local, regional and national governments. Work on a European level, integrate European policy. Look for partners across borders.
- Support **demonstration sites**. It is about communication on all levels, near and far, also online."

EFFORTS CONGRESS MAASTRICHT 2023 (NL)


With 80 participants in the Dutch city of Maastricht from 12 countries, the annual general meeting and the 8th annual EFFORTS congress **'Open the Gates : New Realities for fortified heritage'** was a success. The congress adopted the EFFORTS Maastricht Manifesto, calling on EU institutions and fortified heritage cities to act responsibly and concretely in the interest of sustainable regional development. 

In the frame of the ongoing EFFORTS Goes Green project, EFFORTS and its members want to be ready for the coming years in which the quality of life of our citizens will ever more connected to their identity and their future needs. Fortification is at the crossroads of these themes. With the Maastricht congress, and building on the results of the last congresses, the Faro Convention and the New European Bauhaus, this was the occasion to participate on the themes that matter: integrating

communities, green energy and rethinking tourism. The congress, introducing the interactive 'EFFORTS Court' concept, this year with **Garderhoj Fortet (DA)**, **Culemborg (NL) and Terezin Fortress (CZ**), was lined with site visits, discussions in the town, and panel discussions. The results of the congress discussions were taken up in the **2023 EFFORTS Maastricht Manifesto**.













EFFORTS CONGRESS 2024 in CLUJ-NAPOCA (RO)

The 2024 congress of EFFORTS **"Fortified heritage regional development as drivers for cohesion in Europe"** (working title) will be organised in the Transsylvanian city of Cluj-Napoca in Romania in the fall of 2024. Hungarian EFFORTS members will be included (Hungary holds the EU Council of Ministers at that time). Date : October (exact date will be communicated in January). Co-organiser is the National Museum of Transsylvanian History, together with City of Cluj-Napoca and the municipal Cultural Center. Subjects are EU Interreg Reviving the Fortress Regions / Forthero project proposal themes on regional development (governance, sustainable tourism in rural regions), fortified heritage as a driver for cohesion policy, cross-border cooperation, all in the frame of the ongoing EFFORTS Goes Green process and the European Green Deal. Romanian and Hungarian cities will be asked to discuss their ideas on a cohesion policy. The congress will come to a strategy paper that will be presented in Brussels.



GALLA PLACIDIA BUNKER LINE CONFERENCE

Through our EFFORTS member at the University of Bologna – Ravenna (IT), EFFORTS participated on 21 December 2023 in the bunker line project conference with EFFORTS network member Vallo Alpino (IT) and EFFORTS member Raversyde (BE).



'FORTIC' – INTERREG ITALY-CROATIA project

A project proposal titled FORTIC, "From remains **O**f the war to the a**R**chi**T**ecture of peace in the crossborder area of Italy-**C**roatia," has been approved for financing under the first call of the Interreg Italy – Croatia Cross-Border Cooperation Program for the period 2021-2027.

Serving as the lead partner, the City of Pula collaborates with other Croatian and Italian partners to foster cross-border cooperation, knowledge exchange, and the transfer of successful heritage management models as a basis for sustainable tourism development within Priority 4 of the program, focusing on Culture and Tourism for sustainable development.

Pula's partners in the project include the University of Juraj Dobrila in Pula, the EFFORTS Europe member PCI **Fortress of Culture Šibenik**, and the City of Korčula from Croatia. On the Italian side, partners include the municipalities of Vieste and Cervia, as well as **Ca' Foscari University in Venice**.

Associated partners in the project consist of the School for Education and Training in Pula, the Tourist Board of the City of Korčula, and the Venetian association UNPLI Veneto, aiming to promote tourism at the local and regional levels in the Veneto region. EFFORTS and Forte Cultura will support the project execution.

The total budget for the FORTIC project is €2,135,773.60. The project is planned to last for 30 months, during which various activities will be conducted with a strong emphasis on cross-border collaboration in the field of sustainable cultural tourism, focusing on preserving traditional heritage.

OUDENAARDE

In 2023, Oudenaarde's Mayor Marnic De Meulemeester took over as EFFORTS President from Frank Petter. Oudenaarde's history as a fortified city begins in 1668 with the Peace of Aachen, which awarded it to France as a fortified town. Oudenaarde was strategically important due to its location on the Scheldt.

The Kezelfort is a 9-hectare fort of the Oudenaarde fortress, built between 1822-1824 as part of the **Wellington barrier** during the Dutch period. It is the only fort in the history of Flanders that was equipped with a counter-mine system. After the fort was decommissioned from 1850, a wealthy family built a watchtower on the former fort grounds.

The Kezelfort is the only remnant of the fortified city in Oudenaarde that the government had built against a possible invasion from France. The reason why Oudenaarde was fortified by forts has to do with its relief. The city could easily be fired upon from two heights. To prevent this, the fortification engineers planned the construction of two forts: one on the Kezelenberg (also called Edelareberg) and one on the height of Bevere on the other side of the city. The Beverefort never came to be.

The Dutch Ravelijn of Oudenaarde


During the Calvinist reign (1579-1582), the French Huguenot de la Noué erected triangular, ravelin-like strongholds in front of the then gates. After the Devolution War (1667-1668), Oudenaarde became part of France. In 1670 Vauban started fortification works and erected several ravelins. A ravelin with clad walls is being built approximately at the location of the current Hollands Ravelijn. After the War of the Spanish Succession (1701-1715), Oudenaarde returned to the Southern Netherlands. Oudenaarde becomes a so-called barrier city with a Dutch garrison. In 1782, Joseph II orders all Barrier Cities to be dismantled, with the obligation to demolish the fortifications. This also happens in Oudenaarde. The Liedts family purchases large tracts of fortified land, including the site of the current Hollands Ravelijn. After the fall of Napoleon, the two Netherlands were united under William I. The Wellington barrier was erected on the border with France. Oudenaarde had to be fortified again.

The city is looking for the redevelopment of its heritage sites, together with its public and private partners. It therefor a longtime member of EFFORTS, and also of the Vlaamse Vestingsteden Platform and the Wellington Barrier Project.



NEW MEMBERS and the NETWORK


EFFORTS welcomes in 2023 its new members : Cities of Diest, Menen, Mons, Herentals, Stabroek (BE), Huis ten Bergh (NL), Fort Monostor (HU) rejoined, National Museum of Transsylvanian History in Cluj (RO), the Dutch Fortified City Association with extra 6 cities (NL), and the Ukrainian partners led by the Polytechnic U. of Lviv, among which the Cultural organisation of the city of Ivano-Frankivsk. A network cooperation was done with the Fortress Study Group, the Palmerston Forts Society and the U. of Portsmouth (UK).

EFFORTS participated, through its founding with EFFORTS members Regionale Landschappen and Simon Stevin of the association Fortengordels, the network set-up of the Flemish cultural project Interlinie. In November the project, including EFFORTS member Antwerp, was launched at Edegem (Fort 5) with the partners. EFFORTS member Schans Landmolen and Stafort are associated to the project.





INTERNSHIP AT EFFORTS BRUSSELS

Romanian intern Andrei Vladescu from the U. of Bologna-Ravenna joins the EFFORTS secretariat in Brussels for 2 months. He is working on a satellite detection project of disappeared fortified sites. He is a Brialmont fortifications expert (19th century Belgian fortress builder Brialmont constructed the Bucarest fortress belt) and therefore will work at the EFFORTS member Simon Stevin Foundation's archives and the Belgian National Archives.
